



CARETAKER RELATIONSHIPS

When IDNYC applicants are not able to meet all of IDNYC's proof requirements by themselves, they may be able to apply successfully with a Caretaker. Caretakers provide their own identity documentation to supplement the applicants'. IDNYC now has new categories of caretakers for applicants who have a physical, mental, intellectual, or developmental disability. These new provisions were designed to help disabled individuals apply for the card, regardless of their age.

When applying with the help of a caretaker, the applicant and caretaker both must bring in the following documentation:

IDNYC Application Instructions

YOU MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA TO APPLY FOR AN IDNYC CARD:

1. At least 4 points of documents, including at least 3 points proving identity and at least 1 point proving residency.
2. At least 1 of the documents submitted must have a photo, unless applicant is accompanied by a caretaker.
3. At least 1 of the documents submitted must include date of birth.

No expired documents will be accepted unless specifically mentioned in the IDNYC Document Guide.

Only original documents and copies certified by the issuing agency will be accepted; laminated documents will be accepted only if they were originally issued in a laminated state.

CONSISTENCY OF NAMES

IDNYC will accept documents bearing names that are consistent with each other. The IDNYC card will have the name as listed on your highest value proof of identity document (such as your passport, driver license, birth certificate, consular ID, etc.) unless you also present a name change court order, marriage certificate, or another government-issued document that establishes a lawful name-change. In the event that an applicant presents two identity documents that are worth an equal number of points, the IDNYC application must display the name on the document that includes a photo.

AGE REQUIREMENT

The minimum age to apply for an IDNYC card is 14. Applicants ages 14 and older may apply without a legal guardian or caretaker.

APPLICANTS AGE 14-21 WITHOUT PHOTO IDENTIFICATION OR PROOF OF RESIDENCY

An applicant ages 14-21 without photo identification or proof of residency may apply if accompanied by a caretaker who can demonstrate proof of a relationship to the applicant. An eligible caretaker is a birth parent, adoptive parent, stepparent, legal guardian, legal custodian, foster care parent, an authorized employee of the NYC Administration for Children Services (ACS) or an ACS foster care agency, or an adult sponsor of a minor, appointed by U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Refugee Resettlement.

APPLICANTS WITH DISABILITIES WITHOUT PHOTO IDENTIFICATION OR PROOF OF RESIDENCY

Regardless of age, an applicant with disabilities who lacks photo identification or proof of address may apply if accompanied by a caretaker who can demonstrate proof of a relationship to the applicant. Eligible caretakers for applicants of any age include: **authorized employees** from the NY State Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD), the NYS Department of Health (NYS DOH), the New York State Office of Mental Health (NYS OMH), the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (NYC DOHMH), ACS, a designated ACS foster care agency, or an OPWDD, NYS DOH or NYC DOHMH provider, including **employees of residential care facilities** operated, certified or funded by OPWDD, NYS OMH, NYS DOH or NYC DOHMH; **cohabitants of the applicant** who has been determined by OPWDD to be a person with a developmental disability; or an **applicant's Social Security Representative Payee**.

ALL APPLICANTS APPLYING WITH A CARETAKER

An applicant applying with a caretaker must provide at least 2 points of documents proving identity, including date of birth. The applicant and caretaker must also provide proof of the Caretaker Relationship as listed in the caretaker section of the IDNYC Document Guide. The caretaker must provide at least 3 points of documents proving his or her own identity, including photo identification. If the applicant is unable to provide a proof of residency document, the caretaker may establish their own proof of residency using one of the proof of residency documents listed in the IDNYC Document Guide and provide an attestation that the applicant resides with the caretaker.

RESIDENCY FOR APPLICANTS WHO ARE HOMELESS OR SURVIVORS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

All IDNYC applicants, except individuals without a home address and survivors of domestic violence, are required to provide their home address. An applicant who lives in a homeless shelter can provide a letter with the shelter's address, stating that they have resided there for at least 15 days and that the shelter allows residents to remain at the residence for at least 30 days. An applicant who lacks a home address or is a survivor of domestic violence is required to prove residency within New York City, but may designate a non-profit organization or religious institution whose address will appear on the card as the applicant's care-of address. IDNYC cards that do not display an address, or which display a care-of address, may not be accepted in certain circumstances.

P.O. boxes are not permitted unless the applicant provides proof that he or she is part of the NYS Address Confidentiality Program or resides in an NYC shelter for survivors of domestic violence.

VETERAN DESIGNATION

If you are a U.S. Veteran you can have "Veteran" printed on the front of your IDNYC card. To apply, you need an original or certified copy of one of the documents listed in the Proof of Veteran Status section in the IDNYC Document Guide. If you need assistance obtaining proof of your military service, the Mayor's Office of Veterans' Affairs can help. You can reach them online at www.nyc.gov/veterans, or by calling 212-442-4171.

REPLACEMENT CARDS

An application for a replacement of a lost, stolen, or damaged card has a fee of \$10, unless the applicant signs a hardship waiver. Replacement cards are only available at IDNYC Department of Finance Enrollment Centers.

You must meet the following criteria to apply for an IDNYC card:

- Letter for parent/guardian of student enrolled in Head Start, Early Learn, or any NYC DOE school (dated within 60 days). The applicant must provide proof of relationship to the student.
- Letter for student or parent/guardian of student enrolled in a private or parochial school (dated within 60 days). If applicant is the parent of a student he/she must provide proof of relationship to the student.
- Letter from ACS or ACS foster care agency (dated within 60 days)
- NYC DOE Student Verification Form (available at DOE schools)
- SYEP Verification Form
- Letter from homeless shelter in NYC (must state applicant has stayed at the shelter for 15 days and the shelter allows residents to remain for more than 30 days)
- Letter from residential care facility operated, certified, or funded by NYS OPWDD, NYS OMH, NYS DOH, or NYC DOHMH (dated within 60 days)

Spouses and Domestic Partners: Applicants who are unable to prove residency by providing one of the documents above with their own name, may present a document with their spouse or domestic partner's name and either (1) a certificate of marriage, civil union, or domestic partnership, or (2) a child's birth certificate, demonstrating the applicant's relationship to the spouse or domestic partner. The applicant must also present an attestation signed by the spouse or domestic partner establishing that they reside with the applicant.

One (1) Point Documents - Proof of Residency for applicants without a home address or survivors of domestic violence

- "Care-of Letter" Issued by nonprofit organization or religious institution in NYC serving homeless individuals or survivors of domestic violence. Entity must currently receive City funding. Letter must indicate applicant has received services from the entity for past 60 days and may use entity's address for mailing purposes (dated within 14 days). Address on card will be "Care-of" the organization.

cont... One (1) Point Documents - Proof of Residency for applicants without a home address or survivors of domestic violence

- Letter from City agency, nonprofit organization, or religious institution in NYC that provides services to homeless individuals (dated within 30 days). No address will appear on the card.
- Letter from City agency, nonprofit organization, or religious institution in NYC that provides services to survivors of domestic violence (dated within 30 days). No address will appear on the card.
- Letter Issued by a hospital or health clinic in NYC (dated within 30 days).

Caretaker Relationship - Proof of relationship between caretaker and applicant

Applicant must also provide at least 2 points proving identity, including DOB. Caretaker must provide at least 3 points proving his/her own identity, including photo identification. Ages of applicants who can use each document are indicated in parentheses.

- Applicant's birth certificate (21 years and under)
- Adoption decree, certificate of adoption, or NYS DOH Report of Adoption (21 years and under)
- Acknowledgment of Paternity form issued by NYC DOHMH, and NYS OTDA (21 years and under)
- Letter from ACS or ACS foster care agency (21 years and under)
- Court Order of Paternity/Filiation (21 years and under)
- Applicant's birth certificate and stepparent's certificate of marriage, civil union, or domestic partnership (21 years and under)
- "Verification of Release" form issued by the U.S. HHS/ORR (21 years and under)
- Foreign court order appointing caretaker as applicant's legal guardian (21 years and under)
- U.S. court order appointing the caretaker as applicant's legal guardian, custodian, or conservator (any age)
- Notice of Decision or Determination (NOD) of Developmental Disability issued by NYS OPWDD and proof of residency for caretaker and applicant (any age)
- Letter from a residential care facility (dated within 60 days; any age)
- Letter from SSA establishing the individual caretaker as the applicant's Representative Payee (dated within 1 year; any age)
- Letter from SSA establishing an organization as the applicant's Representative Payee (dated within 1 year) AND a letter from the organization establishing the employee/representative is authorized to represent the applicant (dated within 60 days; any age)
- Letter from NYS OPWDD, NYS DOH, NYS OMH, NYC DOHMH, or one of their providers (dated within 60 days; any age)

IDNYC is accepted as your proof of identity:

- By NYC agencies when applying for City services, including marriage licenses, birth certificates, and benefits like SNAP, Cash Assistance, and Section 8
- By NYPD police officers as valid identification
- For entering public buildings like schools
- For taking the high school equivalency exam in New York State

IDNYC can be used:

- As a **library card** at the Brooklyn, New York, and Queens Public Library Systems. Take your IDNYC card to a librarian to make it your library card.
- As **BigAppleRx**, the City of New York's official **prescription discount card**, which has saved users an average of 50% on prescription medications. Simply show your pharmacist the BIN and GRP on the back of your card to save.
